

## Plutarch on the “E” at Delphi

οὐ μὴν ἀλλὰ κάν εἰς οὗτος ἡ μονογενής, ως οἴεται  
καὶ Ἀριστοτέλης, τρόπον τινὰ καὶ τοῦτον ἐκ  
πέντε σύγκειμενον κόσμων καὶ συνηρμοσμένον  
εἶναι· ὃν ὁ μὲν ἔστι γῆς ὁ δ' ὕδατος, τρίτος δὲ  
πυρὸς καὶ τέταρτος ἀέρος· τὸν δὲ πέμπτον  
οὐρανὸν οἱ δὲ φῶς οἱ δ' αἰθέρα καλοῦσιν, οἱ δ' αὐτὸ<sup>ν</sup>  
τοῦτο πέμπτην οὐσίαν...

κάν even if

εἰς one (single)

οὗτος this [κόσμος world]

ἡ is (present subjunctive in the condition)

μονογενής only created, only begotten

ώς οἴεται καὶ Ἀριστοτέλης "as Aristotle also thinks"

τρόπον τινὰ in some way (accusative of respect)

ἐκ πέντε κόσμων "from five worlds"

σύγκειμενον consisting (present participle)

συνηρμοσμένον joined together

εἶναι is [understand φησί "he says"] (infinitive of "to be" in indirect statement)

ὃν of which (genitive plural of the relative pronoun)

ὁ μὲν...ὁ δέ one ... another ...

γῆ, γῆς, ἡ earth

ὕδωρ, ὕδατος, τό water

πῦρ, πυρός, τό fire

ἀήρ, ἀέρος, ἡ/ό air

τρίτος, τέταρτος, πέμπτος third, fourth, fifth

οἱ δὲ [but/and] others

φῶς, φωτός, τό light

αἰθήρ, αἰθέρος, ἡ/ό upper air

αὐτὸ τοῦτο this itself

καλοῦσιν they call

οὐσία essence, substance (πέμπτη οὐσία quintessence)

## Plutarch

"Ἐτι δ' ἰσχύσασα μᾶλλον ἡ τῶν πέντε συμμετρία καὶ δύναμις οὐκ εἴασεν εἰς ἄπειρα γένη προελθεῖν τὸ ἔμψυχον, ἀλλὰ πέντε τῶν ζώντων ἀπάντων ἴδεας παρέσχεν. εἰσὶ γὰρ θεοὶ δῆπου καὶ δαίμονες καὶ ἥρωες καὶ μετὰ τούτους τὸ τέταρτον ἄνθρωποι γένος, ἔσχατον δὲ καὶ πέμπτον τὸ ἄλογον καὶ θηριώδες.

Περὶ τοῦ ΕΙ τοῦ ἐν Δελφοῖς Plutarch's *Moralia* 390

ἔτι *still, yet, moreover*

ἰσχύσασα μᾶλλον *having gained more strength [than the other numbers]*

δύναμις *power*

εἴασεν *did not permit* (aorist of ἔάω)

εἰς ἄπειρα γένη *to unlimited kinds/types/classes*

προελθεῖν *to go forward, progress* (aorist infinitive of προ- ἔρχομαι)

τὸ ἔμψυχον *the animate, that which has life* (Ψυχή)

τῶν ζώντων ἀπάντων *of all the living things*

ἴδεα *form*

παρέσχεν *has produced* (aorist of παρέχω)

δῆπου *particle, of course*

δαίμονες καὶ ἥρωες *daimones and heroes*

τὸ τέταρτον γένος *the fourth class/kind*

ἔσχατος,-η,-ον *last*

θηριώδης, θηριώδες *adj. beast-like, wild*

### Plutarch 3

ό μὲν γὰρ θεὸς ἔκαστον ἡμῶν ἐνταῦθα προσιόντα  
οἷον ἀσπαζόμενος προσαγορεύει τὸ «γνῶθι σαυτόν»,  
ὅ δὴ τοῦ «χαῖρε» οὐδὲν μεῖον ἔστιν· ἡμεῖς δὲ πάλιν  
ἀμειβόμενοι τὸν θεόν, «εἰ» φαμέν, ως ἀληθῆ καὶ  
ἀψευδῆ καὶ μόνην μόνῳ προσήκουσαν τὴν τοῦ εἶναι  
προσαγόρευσιν ἀποδίδοντες.

περὶ τοῦ ΕΙ τοῦ ἐν Δελφοῖς, Plutarch's *Moralia* 392

ἔκαστος, -η, -ον *each*

ἡμῶν *of us*

ἐνταῦθα *there, to that place (thither); here (hither)*

προσιόντα *going to, approaching* (participle, accusative, agrees with *each*)

οἷον *as it were*

ἀσπαζόμενος *greeting* (participle, nominative, agrees with Apollo)

προσαγορεύω *verb address*

γνῶθι σαυτόν "Know yourself."

χαῖρε *hail! hello! (rejoice) Pl. χαίρετε*

οὐδὲν *nothing*

μεῖον *less*

πάλιν *back, in turn*

ἀμειβόμενοι *answering* (participle)

ἀληθῆς *true*

ἀψευδῆς *unfalse, without deception*

προσήκουσαν *fitting, suitable* (fem. acc. sg.)

προσαγόρευσις *form of address*

ἀποδίδοντες *giving back* (participle, present active, nom., masc., pl.)
